State Measures		
59 (Federal deduction)		The cuts required by Measure 59 will deeply hurt basic services, including those critical to our economy, and increases pressure to raise taxes and fees on businesses.
57 (Alternative to 61)		Measure 57 would put less strain on the funding of critical services than Measure 61 and requires addiction treatment.
61 (Extended sentencing)		Measure 61 would increase drug and theft sentences, costing \$161-274 million per year and \$1.3 billion borrowed for prison construction. This increase would jeopardize funding for other critical services.
65 (Open primary)		Measure 65 would encourage candidates to appeal to a broad voter base, producing a more balanced approach to the state's most pressing issues.
City of Portland Measures		
Children's Investment Fund		By renewing our current investment in childhood development, our community will see significant dividends in terms of lower costs for social programs in the future.
PCC Bond Measure		PCC's facilities have exceeded their capacity to train workers for area businesses and need additional funds to give future employees the skills they need to serve the region's industries.
Other Levies		
Gresham Public Safety Levy		The levy would fund increased police services in Gresham to target gangs, drugs, property crimes, family crimes and provide a much needed overall increased police presence in the community.
Centennial School Levy		The bond measure would build a new elementary and middle school on a shared site, renovate existing schools, replace the Centennial Learning Center and repair health and safety hazards at its aging facilities.
